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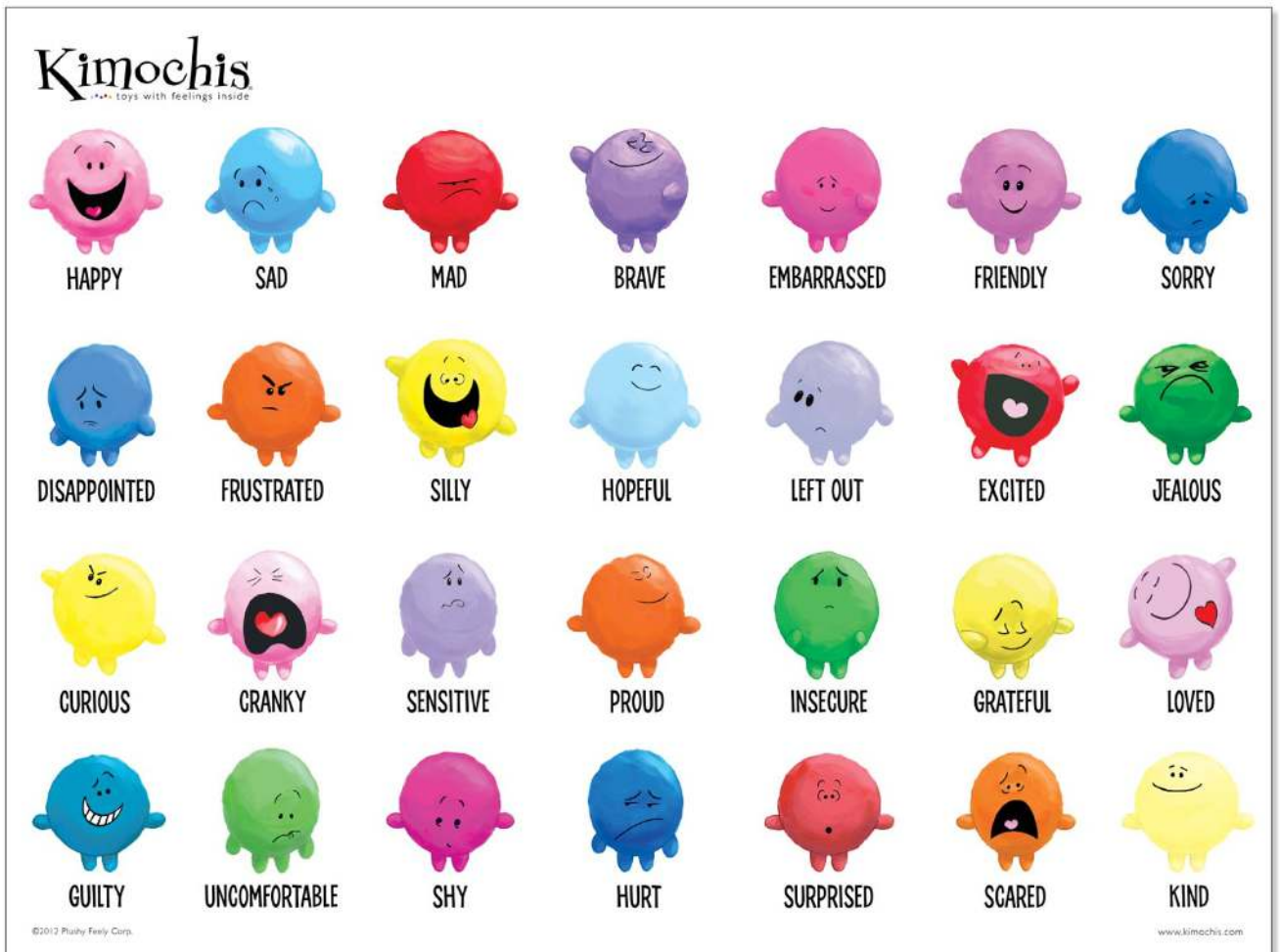

Positive Parenting



ZERO TO THREE
Early connections last a lifetime

Positive parenting describes a set of parental behaviors that foster a child's capacity to **love, trust, explore and learn**. The goal of positive parenting is to help parents guide their children's healthy development in the context of the family's culture. Key elements of positive parenting include the ability to:

Understand or imagine the **child's point of view**, especially during challenging moments.



Respond with interest and **sensitivity** to the child's cues.



Recognize that **parenting can be stressful** and missteps are a natural part of child-rearing.



Recognize and **celebrate** the child's strengths, abilities, and capacity to learn and develop.



Provide consistent, **age-appropriate guidelines** and limits for child behavior.



Work toward a **balance** of meeting parental needs and child needs.



Delight in **moments of connection** with the child;



Recognize and **regulate their own feelings** and behaviors before they respond to the child.



Seek help, support or additional information on parenting **when needed.**

ACTIVITY/LESSON DESCRIPTION		
<p>Let the two children play by each other and give them each some transportation toys to play with and help them share the toys with each other. Also ask them what toys each of the children have and what is different and the same about them.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">For example, Max has a red car and Jack has a red airplane. They are both red but they are different types of transportation.</p>		

ACTIVITY #3 TITLE	LEARNING GOAL/OBJECTIVE	MATERIALS
Lay Some Different Transportation Toys on the Floor	For a non-mobile child to look and try and reach and touch the toys	Different Transportation Toys
ACTIVITY/LESSON DESCRIPTION		
Let your child lay on the floor and look or try and reach and touch the toys that are in front or on the side of them.

Show your child some pictures of different types of transportation and talk about what they are and what they do.

ACTIVITY #2 TITLE	LEARNING GOAL/OBJECTIVE	MATERIALS
Getting Ready to Get in the Car.	The goal is to teach your child about routines and developing more language skills by talking to them while you are getting ready to leave.	A Car
ACTIVITY/LESSON DESCRIPTION		
<p>When you are getting ready to go in the car, talk to your child about what you are doing and where you are going.</p> <p>For example, Sam we are getting ready to get in the car to go to drive to the store. Do you know what sound a car makes, vroom vroom, that's right the car does go vroom vroom. I am so proud of you for knowing that. Before we leave we have to make sure you are all buckled in to your car seat, and when mommy gets in the car she will buckle her seat belt. We want to make sure that we both are safe when the car is moving.</p>		

THE ARTS & SENSORY ACTIVITIES, MUSIC & MOVEMENT

ACTIVITY #1 TITLE	LEARNING GOAL/OBJECTIVE	MATERIALS
<p>Naming and Acting Out the Different Types of Transportation</p>	<p>The objective is to teach your child all the different types of transportation that is out there. For example, Busses, Trains, Cars, Planes, Boats, and Trucks.</p>	<p>Different toys that represent transportation, pictures and your imagination.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">ACTIVITY/LESSON DESCRIPTION</p>		
<p>Take out as many cars, trucks, airplanes, boats and busses you may have around the house. Start out by naming all the items and say or imitate what the transportation toy does.</p> <p>For example, “Jack do you know what this is, this is a car can you say car”? The car goes vroom vroom when we take it to Grandma’s house. Another example, would be showing them a picture of an airplane and demonstrate how an airplane fly’s in the sky, have them join in and try and fly like an air plane to.</p>		

ACTIVITY #2 TITLE	LEARNING GOAL/OBJECTIVE	MATERIALS
The Wheels on the Bus	The objective is for your child learn the different things that the buss does and learning the motions to how things move and sound. It also teaches them the different sounds that can be on busses.	The song The Wheels on the Bus https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=e_04ZrNroTo
ACTIVITY/LESSON DESCRIPTION		
Sing along with the video or just sing it to your child without the video. Also encourage your child to join in with you on doing the hand motions.		

ACTIVITY #3 TITLE	LEARNING GOAL/OBJECTIVE	MATERIALS
Color or Paint a Picture of a Car	Letting your child explore through their senses and learning fine motor with learning to hold a crayon or marker.	Picture of a car, and markers or paint.
ACTIVITY/LESSON DESCRIPTION		
Let your child just draw or move around paint on their picture and let them explore through their sense. While your child is coloring or painting you can talk to them about what they are coloring or painting and ask them what sound the car makes, and talk about all the different places you can go and see when driving or riding in a car.

Counting Different Types of Transportation You See	Learning to Count	Different Types of Transportation
ACTIVITY/LESSON DESCRIPTION		
<p style="text-align: center;">Go on a walk and when you are out walking name and count all the different types of transportation you might see.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">For example, look Amelia there is one airplane in the sky, do you see it. Do you know how to fly like an airplane?</p>		

ACTIVITY #2 TITLE	LEARNING GOAL/OBJECTIVE	MATERIALS
What are the Colors of These Types of Transportation?	Introducing and Learning About Colors	Different Color Toys or Pictures of Transportation
ACTIVITY/LESSON DESCRIPTION		
<p style="text-align: center;">While playing with the transportation toys that you child might have, talk about what color and how big the toy is.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">For example, this boat is blue, and this boat is red. Do you know what boat is bigger? The blue boat is bigger.</p>		

ACTIVITY #3 TITLE	LEARNING GOAL/OBJECTIVE	MATERIALS
Will my Trucks Sink or Float	Learning if your truck will sink or float in the water.	Trucks, and Water Table or Water Bin.
ACTIVITY/LESSON DESCRIPTION		
<p>Let your child play around in the water with their trucks, and ask them let's see what happens with this red truck if we let it go in the water, it might sink or it might float. Look at that the red truck floats, let's try it with the green truck. Oh no the green one doesn't float.</p>
