

ACTIVITY #2 TITLE	LEARNING GOAL/OBJECTIVE	MATERIALS
Coloring Together	Uses fingers and hands. Uses writing and drawing tools.	Large piece of paper and markers, or colored pencils, or crayons, or make a dot marker.

Place the paper that you have on the floor and sit with your child on the floor. If you have a big piece of paper it is fine for your child to sit on the paper. Grab any drawing tool that you have and ask your child to join you. You can draw an outline of a tree, or a flower and ask your child to help you color it.


ACTIVITY/LESSON DESCRIPTION



With Parent or Independently. Cut along the outer dotted lines to make the strips easier to hand and allow kids to hole punch them .The letter bank has two lines of letters to allow more variety of letters in the bank. Kids can find the lowercase letters, in the word bank, that match the uppercase letter. Once they have found the matches they can hole punch them. When that strip is complete, they can move on to the next.



ACTIVITY #2 TITLE	LEARNING GOAL/OBJECTIVE	MATERIALS
Rainbow Alphabet	Matching colors of the rainbow with the corresponding magnetic letter color	Large white paper, colored markers, colored letter magnets and tape



With parent/caregiver OR independently.

Draw a rainbow on a larger piece of paper and tape it down to a table or a magnetic surface (like the refrigerator or a cookie sheet). Have your child match the color of the rainbows with the corresponding letter colors.





The letter T stands for Trees! Take a walk with your child to look for leaves, twigs, bark, or any other tree related items and use them to fill the blank space in the T using glue.



THE ARTS & SENSORY ACTIVITIES: MUSIC & MOVEMENT

ACTIVITY #1 TITLE	LEARNING GOAL/OBJECTIVE	MATERIALS
Make your own instrument: Rainstick	Explores dance and movement. Uses fingers and hands.	Cardboard roll Beans or rice Decorative tape(optional), or you can use paint or markers for decoration. Duct tape

ACTIVITY/LESSON DESCRIPTION

Decorate the tube. Add the beans or rice. Tape the ends with duct tape, and enjoy the sound with your child.







ACTIVITY #2 TITLE	LEARNING GOAL/OBJECTIVE	MATERIALS
Dance	Demonstrate Balancing Skills	Computer or Phone

Play the song "If I were a Tree" by Jason Mesches following this link <u>If I Were A Tree (Tu B'shevat Song</u>). Ask your child to follow your movements.



ACTIVITY #3 TITLE	LEARNING GOAL/OBJECTIVE	MATERIALS
Little Seed	Learning how trees and plants start to grow. Using their oral skills and creative expression to sing along.	Below song sheet

"Here's a little seed, in the dark, dark ground."


Hold left hand on top of right hand - right hand is in a ball.

"Out comes the warm sun, yellow and round."

Stretch out both hands to represent the sun.

"Down, comes the rain, wet and slow."

Hold hands close, and charade the hands down to represent the rain falling down. "Up comes the little seed, grow, grow, grow!" Hold both hands together and spout them up.





ACTIVITY #4 TITLE	LEARNING GOAL/OBJECTIVE	MATERIALS
Blooming Paper Flowers	Demonstrates knowledge of the characteristics of living things. Counts. Uses fingers and hands	Copy paper Container of water Scissors Markers



Start by cutting out some paper flowers, then colored them with markers. Fold the flower petals into the center. You don't want to fold them tightly, just a loose fold or they won't open. Do not press the creases too tight. Fill a plastic container with a few inches of water. Place the fold flower into the water. The paper will absorb the water causing it to open the petals.


ACTIVITY #3 TITLE	LEARNING GOAL/OBJECTIVE	MATERIALS
Nature Head	Using creative expression and coordination to add flowers to the head as hair.	Flowers and Leaves Face Outline

ACTIVITY/LESSON DESCRIPTION



Talk about hair and where the hair is located on the head. Put glue on the top of the head, and then have the student put their desired hair on.







MATHEMATICS & SCIENCE ACTIVITIES

ACTIVITY #1 TITLE	LEARNING GOAL/OBJECTIVE	MATERIALS
Window Greenhouse	Lifecycle of plants, STEAM	Seeds. Paper Towel or Cotton Ball, Ziplock bag, Tape

ACTIVITY/LESSON DESCRIPTION

With Parent then Independently

Students will "plant" a seed by putting it with a moist paper towel or cotton ball into a baggie and tape it to a window. Students will be able to witness and measure the growth of their seedling over time.

ACTIVITY #2 TITLE	LEARNING GOAL/OBJECTIVE	MATERIALS
Chlorophyll Rubbings	Parts of Plants, STEAM	Leaves, grass, plant parts that are green, tree print out, metal spoon

ACTIVITY/LESSON DESCRIPTION

Chlorophyll paintings are a fun and creative way to integrate art and science as students learn about plants, the process of photosynthesis, and how a plant makes its own food.



ACTIVITY #3 TITLE	LEARNING GOAL/OBJECTIVE	MATERIALS
PomPom Shooters	Engineering, STEAM	 Yourself Pom poms! 1" or smaller work best (Don't have pom poms? Cotton balls, marshmallows, and crumpled balls of paper work too.) Pool noodle, cup, or toilet paper roll Balloons Scissors Duct tape Paper, cardboard, or card stock (for target) Pencil, pen, or markers (for target)





MATH & SCIENCE INDEPENDENT PRACTICE

ACTIVITY #1

DIRECTIONS: Students will "plant" a seed by putting it with a moist paper towel or cotton ball into a baggie and tape it to a window. Students will be able to witness and measure the growth of their seedling over time.





MATH & SCIENCE INDEPENDENT PRACTICE

ACTIVITY #2

DIRECTIONS: To make the paintings:

- 1. Fold a sheet of white paper in half. Place several leaves between the folded paper.
- 2. Press firmly on the leaves between the pages and rub with a metal spoon. Avoid plastic spoons as they break when pressed as firmly as necessary.
- 3. It's best not to use leaves with a waxy feel since they are harder to press and don't release their chlorophyll easily.



Your child may find that after they start rubbing with the spoon they may want to use their fingers to rub it instead. While doing this activity, talk about the texture of the leaves, what they notice works best, and what the green in the leaves actually is.



MATH & SCIENCE INDEPENDENT PRACTICE

ACTIVITY #3

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. The first step is to cut the body of your shooter. If you're using a toilet paper roll, skip this step. If you're using a pool noodle, cut off a length about 4" long. And if you're using a paper cut, grab a knife and an adult to do this. Carefully cut out the bottom of the cup so it's open on both ends.
- 2. Grab a balloon and tie a knot in the end. Cut off about 1/4" of the tip end (away from the knot).
- 3. Stretch the balloon over the end of the pool noodle, cup, or toilet paper roll as far as you can, centering the knot over the hole.
- 4. Secure the balloon to pool noodle, cup, or toilet paper roll with duct tape.
- 5. This is the part where it gets really fun. Pointing away from others, insert a pom pom into the shooter, pull the balloon knot, and FIRE! If you're using a toilet paper roll or cup, point the open end upwards towards the sky a bit for shooting. This makes the pom pom drop down into the balloon and get a bigger force. The pool noodle doesn't need this because it has a hole in the middle that helps compress the air for greater force.
