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2023 IMPACT REPORT

In 2023, JP Austin focused on community.

2023 was a benchmark year as we celebrated our 10-year anniversary and solidified the expanded community we have built over the last two years through our non-residential program. We invested in our residential campus — updating families’ apartments and refreshing our communal spaces — and held monthly Sisterhood events that brought together JP moms and kids living on and off campus.

Single mother sisterhood sustains women and families in pursuit of economic mobility. Throughout 2023, 78% of moms persisted in their college, career, and leadership journeys — and with JP Austin. Amidst continued city-wide shortages in early childhood educators, we reciprocated the investment our Child Development Center (CDC) teachers are making in JP kids and families by increasing teacher pay to \$23-29 per hour and offering additional opportunities for professional development, including a new Early Childhood Education (ECE) Fellowship.
